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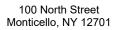

- We have been battling a COVID outbreak which started in January, we are hopeful we will soon come off infection control precautions.
- Hiring and recruitment efforts are ongoing, (mostly nursing) we have 4 CNAs that tested 2/25 and we continue to recruit and train as able. Our last orientation class had 9 individuals, all clinical. Current recruiting focus is clinical staff for day due to staff moving to other positions in the facility.
- Bonuses and Incentives remain in place to assist with hiring staff and for existing staff to encourage them to pick up additional shifts. We are continuing
  the TNA program to create more CNAs. We are expanding our recruitment efforts into neighboring cities and towns.
- Our annual survey ended on 1/5/2023 and we have submitted the Plan of Correction to DOH. We have received approval and continue to address the deficiencies found during Survey.

#### Infection Control

- All staff and visitors continue to be screened when entering the facility. This includes temperature checks, request for vaccination status from visitors, and adherence to infection control precautions for all individuals in the facility at all times.
- DOH continues to require daily surveys submitted via Health Commerce.

#### **Director's Comments / Local Government Unit Update:**

#### **Care Management:**

• The care management unit continues to actively engage clients for both Health Home agencies and the HARP Services (Health and Recovery Plan) which are Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care Health Plans. As of the end of January 2023, there are five active Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) orders and two people on enhanced services with one investigation in progress.

#### Adult & Children's SPOA:

- On January 12, 2023, the Adult SPOA Committee reviewed four new cases, 42 previous cases were reviewed. Six new referrals and 10 previous referrals were reviewed by the Children's SPOA Committee on January 26.
- There are 9 people on the list for Family Care. At this time there are no openings.
- Supportive housing provided by RSS: 117 (+0) beds filled, 22 (+0) open beds, 401 (-3) waitlisted.
- Coordination of referrals and ongoing collaboration with service providers continue. Clients were recommended for/linked to various services, including: behavioral health treatment providers, RSS housing (apartment program and community residences), Access: Supported Housing, Sullivan PROS Program, OFA, APS, Action Toward Independence, Independent Living, Inc., and Care Management services.

#### Behavioral Health Clinic (Mental Health and Substance Abuse):

- In January there were 90 clients on the high risk census.
- Community Services assists in providing Naloxone to clients. The Department of Health (DOH) has provided a Community Calendar of free Naloxone Trainings which are held several times a week. The project shifted focus from providing sustainable video-based telehealth services to opioid use disorder treatment approaches. OMH has shifted the language regarding MAT (Medication Assisted Treatment) to MOUD (Medication for Opioid Use Disorder) and also MAUD (Medication for Alcohol Use Disorder) to communicate that medication is its own form of treatment, rather than secondary role to therapy. OMH would like this to be the standard front-line approach for treating these disorders.

#### **Local Government Unit:**

- Access to Services limited due to staff shortage but continuing triage for hospital discharges and court referrals predominately seeing persons for medication management
- Working with our local 911 and Duchess 988 regarding collaboration and training for 911 dispatchers and referral information.
- Continued participation in the HEALing Communities Study as a Wave 2 Community: Phase 5 of the Communities that HEAL Intervention with ongoing
  planning and continued collaboration with community stakeholders. We continue working to implement the identified strategies related to Opioid Overdose
  Education & Naloxone Distribution (OEND), Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD), & Safer Opioid Prescribing and Dispensing Practices in our
  community.
- 2023 contracts for continued service delivery: Catholic Charities Community Services of Orange, Sullivan and Ulster; The ARC Greater Hudson Valley, NY; United Way; NAMI Sullivan County, NY; Independent Living, Inc; Rehabilitation Support Services; Action Toward Independence and Hudson Transit Lines.




#### **Social Services:**

- As of 2/3/23 the following amounts have been disbursed under ERAP:
  - o Rental arrears payments- 739 benefits, \$ 5,772,432.54, average payment of \$ 7,811.14
  - o Prospective rent payments- 562 benefits, \$ 1,718,879.91, average payment of \$ 3,058.51
  - o Amounts disbursed continue to increase monthly. The ERAP application officially closed on January 20, 2023. Applications submitted before 11/30/22 are being paid at this point.
- As of 2/3/2023, the Landlord Rental Assistance Program (LRAP) has received 288 applications and made 186 payments
  - o Total disbursed= \$2,245,427.17 (no change since last month)
- Emergency HEAP officially opened on January 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Regular HEAP, HEAP Heating Repair and Replacement Program and Clean and Tune benefits are also available and accepting applications. A second emergency benefit for this season opened on February 27<sup>th</sup>.
- The warming centers in Liberty and Monticello continue to operate 7 days a week. They have been an invaluable resource during the cold weather having served 130 people already.
- The Temporary Assistance Unit started a Rental Supplement Program for individuals that are homeless or in fear of losing their housing. The RSP will assist in paying rent for those who have income but are below 30 % of the Area Median Income (AMI). The program will allow up to 50 % of the AMI if other criteria is met. Details can be obtained through the Department of Social Services.
  - o Applications received as of 2/7/2023: 38
  - o Approved: 21 households with 36 people
  - o Amount disbursed-\$ 75,447.96 \$ 47,856.50 to help with rental arrears \$ 20,783.46 in prospective rent (Number went down due to fire in 2 units displacing tenants- will resume when they get new permanent housing).

## **Training and Quality Improvement**

- **Training Progress**: All attending employees participated in HIPAA refresher training during this month's Agency Staff Meeting. The training session focused on HIPAA Privacy Regulations and how it impacts our agency. The feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive.
- Quality Improvement Initiatives: Preschool Special Education program; Continued to work on the Preschool Special Education program audit. An initial meeting was held with an external auditor who will assist with the audit process.
- Article 28 Diagnostic and Treatment Centers (D&TCs) Fiscal staff have identified an opportunity to claim additional revenue for the county, as all clinic visits were claimed as "threshold" instead of a mix "offsite" and "threshold" visits which is permissible due to clinics being held both onsite and mobile vaccination clinics in the community.


## Patient Services: Certified Home Health Agency/CHHA Census 2022


• The average daily census increased from 182.7 to 190.7 with total patient days 5913. We had 262 CHHA specific patients, 3 LTHHCP, and 31 MCH with a grand total of 283 patients on caseload throughout the month. One RN resigned and will be returning in February per diem; one per diem RN is also assisting on our Value Based Purchasing roll out.


