#### **Student Financial Wellness**

#### Trellis Strategies Student Survey

- -Nationally normed survey -similar to other CC's
- —Response rate of 11% acceptable for this type of survey
- —Distributed in Fall 2024; results received in Spring 2025
- —College's focus: understanding & addressing student need
- --Parent data slightly different see reverse side- parents made up 31% of repondents
- -- Convened all campus meeting to discuss and brainstorm solutions in break out groups

#### Mental Health & Well-Being

- 45% of students reported symptoms of generalized anxiety disorder
- 47% of students feel lonely sometimes or always

#### Supporting Mental Health & Well Being

- New mental health counseling service for Students, Faculty, and Staff (Bettermynd)
- Will provide easy, flexible access to mental health services without the need to visit a
  physical office space, reducing the stigma associated with publicly seeking mental health
  services and removing travel or time constraints
- Greater likelihood of individuals finding a provider they are comfortable with in terms of gender, race, ethnicity, experience, etc.
- Partnering with community groups to offer wellbeing workshops
- Increase communication re available resources

#### Financial Instability & Basic Needs Insecurity

- 51% of students are housing insecure
- 38% experience food insecurity
- 58% worry about having enough money to pay for school
- 30% ran out of money 6+ times in the past year
- 64% would struggle to access \$500 in an emergency
- 70% reported experiencing financial difficulties while in college savings / credit cards
- Over a third using some sort of pubic assistance (food, unemployment, housing, medical and childcare)

Nearly half of those experiencing financial challenges said they had difficulty concentrating on schoolwork because of their financial situation. Basic needs need to be met for them to be able to fully focus on academics.

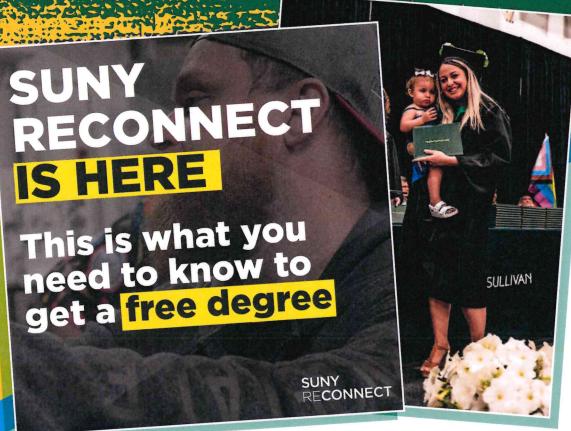
