

I. PLANNING ACTIVITY

- Exemption agreements renewals are in place for all 22 municipalities.
- New DEC wetlands regulations are in place as of January. Planning has been providing information on DEC webinars to help municipalities understand the new rules.
- Planning staff has been attending municipal planning board meetings to foster better coordination and more helpful reviews. Tusten, Woodridge, Fallsburg and Callicoon were scheduled for February.

Land Use, Strategic and Comprehensive Planning

Water Resources and Infrastructure

- Planning consultant Delaware Engineering is making progress on the Countywide Infrastructure Assessment. Draft municipal summaries are due this month.
- Planning and Delaware Engineering with the US Water Alliance have developed a training program for system operators and municipal officials and relevant staff.
 Planning will organize the event for later this winter.
- We continue to actively searching for funding sources that could potentially fund subsurface conditions throughout the County to assess the County's water resources.
- Facilitation of technical assistance to Wurtsboro and Fallsburg from the Water Center at the University of Pennsylvania is paused as the projects are referred to the Environmental Finance Center at Syracuse University.

Hazard Mitigation Plan

- Planning is working with Purchasing to issue an RFP to secure a vendor for updating the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Until a signed grant agreement is in place we are unable to execute a contract, however, we are able to proceed with procurement activities short of award and execution of a contract.
- Letters have been mailed to municipalities requesting written commitments to participate in the update of the plan

Recreation, Quality of Life & Tourism-based Economic Development

Sullivan O&W Rail Trail

- The County, Town and Alta are working to put in place the remaining information needed for NYS DOT for Neversink Crossing project advanced design review. The bid must be issued by March 31 2025. The Town of Fallsburg is moving forward to start their in-kind match.
- The use and occupancy agreement between NYS DOT and the Town of Liberty for the Parksville extension is tied with the acquisition process for multiple parcels related to the rerouting of Route 17. The preliminary engineering is complete. Planning, DPW, DOT, the Town and the

- The Town of Rockland and their engineers completed the first design draft for the Livingston Manor to Dahlia section of the trail.
- Planning has submitted a
 RAISE (Rebuilding American
 Infrastructure with
 Sustainability and Equity)
 grant application for the
 engineering of 28 crosswalks
 and a concept design for a
 preferred route for the
 Liberty Trestle. Planning is
 requesting over \$3M in
 funding. As a rural county,
 there is no required match.
- The signage family for the trail was distributed to the Alliance
 - members. It will allow for community individuality while providing a framework for consistent branding and wayfinding.
- Staff continue to participate in monthly meetings of the O&W Rail Trail Alliance as well as regular meetings with the engineering firm and partner municipalities.
- A press release and associated promotion is in development for the daypack lending project. The packs are now available in 26 schools and libraries. Sullivan Public Library Alliance helped sponsor the project, which was funded through Sullivan 180.
- The SnO&W is scheduled for Saturday, February 22nd in Parksville.
- The 2025 multi day hike (ROAM) will take place on June 6-8 in Mamakating. Partners include Sullivan Catskills Visitors Association, Sullivan 180, Parks and Trails New York, Trout Unlimited, and Open Space Institute.

Community Development & Revitalization

Housing Fund

- Planning staff continue to work with our consultant, Pattern for Progress, to create a program design for a local funding source/trust to support the development of affordable housing units in Sullivan County.
- A final draft of the program will be presented to the Legislature for review and deliberation.



Bicycle and Pedestrian Infrastructure Master Plan

- A resolution formalizing the Advisory Committee is on the agenda today as per recommendations from the grant agency, NYS Department of Environmental Conservation.
- The first meeting of the Advisory Committee will be held on Tuesday February 4, with members receiving a presentation from the County consultant Metropolitan Urban Design Workshop (MUDW) and participating in breakout sessions. The plan will focus on connecting residents and visitors in and around community centers (villages, hamlets) with safe pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure.

RESTORE NY Round 7

 The County is working with RUPCO and the Sullivan County Land Bank to navigate a significant increase in the cost of construction based on the latest cost estimates. RUPCO is waiting for determinations on several grant applications that have been filed for this project.

Economic Development

County Infrastructure Grant Program

- Working with the County Manager's Office and Grants Administration to identify potential projects for the recently released NYS County Infrastructure Grant Program, which can provide up to \$1 million in funding for buildout of infrastructure to support economic development and housing.
- A Request for Expressions of Interest has been advertised and is due on February 21, 2025.

Emerald Corporate Center Economic Development Corporation (ECCEDC)

 We continue to work with the Town of Thompson to transfer Emerald Springs Water Company (ESWC) and all assets to the Town of Thompson, based on discussions with counsel having experience with the process.

Administration

- Continue to participate in regular meetings with County Manager, ITS, Grants, and NYS Empire State Development with regard to Municipal Infrastructure Grant.
- Participated in monthly O&W Rail Trail Alliance meeting
- Attended webinar about the new Short Term Rental Law
- Attended webinar on new wetland regulations
- Met with representatives from Hudson Valley Regional Council as part of their inperson outreach to members
- Attended monthly meeting of the Sullivan County Land Bank

OFFICE OF SUSTAINABLE ENERGY (OSE) II.

- Gravity Renewables has been acquired by the company Relevate. The Lake Goodyear small hydro facility continues to be offline due technical problems. Relevate brings an impressive portfolio of hydroelectric generation to the table as well as potential capital to address the ongoing issues with the plant.
- Staff continue to work toward updating and compiling information for recertification as a Climate Smart Community
- OSE staff have continued to review monthly utility statements, and to work with NYSEG and DPW staff to resolve ongoing issues with meter readings and monthly billings.
- OSE continues to document the County's progress toward reducing energy usage and greenhouse gas emissions while also identifying future clean energy project opportunities.
- An application to reallocate credits generated by the solar array in Liberty under the Remote Net Metering program was submitted to NYSEG prior to the deadline of January 31, 2025.

III. PARKS, RECREATION & BEAUTIFICATION

- The department has received 45 entries for the Sullivan County Parks Photo Exhibition. Winning photos will be on exhibit from March 1-April 30, 2025, at the Government Center, Monticello and the Sullivan County Cultural Center & Museum, Hurleyville.
- Callicoon Park: As part of the SEQR process, we have contracted to have a Cultural Resource Survey completed for the remainder of the park property. The survey is currently on hold until the ground thaws.
- Lake Superior Westside Trail: Final plan revisions have been sent to the Palisades Interstate Park Commission staff for review and approval.
- Park and Recreation Master Plan: Weston & Sampson has compiled information regarding our parks and facilities and is currently working on the draft plan.
- Seasonal staff recruitment for Lake Superior, D&H and park maintenance has begun.
- Currently accepting Group Picnic applications for the 2025 park season.
- Setting up historic presentations at the Sullivan County Museum and D&H Interpretive Center.
- Lake Superior State Park Season Passes are currently available for purchase.

IV. **GRANTS ADMINISTRATION**

Activity/Technical Assistance

- DGA responded to 11 funding resource inquiries since the end of December. Requests included inquiries related to the Legislative Discretionary Grant, home repair, records management, O& W rail trail projects, transportation, AEDs, capital improvements, offgrid community development, and business start-up/expansion projects.
- Assistance has been provided to departments requiring support with the grant process. Of note:
 - Community Resources:
 - DGA met w/ Transportation staff to discuss the development and future submission of the FY24-25 Section 5311 Formula Grants for Rural Areas wherein funding is made available for transportation operating and capital costs.
 - Sullivan County Office for the Aging was awarded the NYSOFA NY Connects allocation in the amount of \$307,611. The NYSOFA Four Year Plan was submitted under the facilitation of Lise-Anne Deoul.
 - Health and Human Services:
 - Supported Community Services with preparation of a NYS Office of Mental Health Crisis Intervention Team program development application.
 - DGA staff continues to assist HHS DSS related to the DASNY SAM preapplication for the renovation of Family Visitation Spaces. Submission of documentation required for the Financial Review is pending, deadline 2/7/25.
 - Monitoring of Public Health grant/allocation programs are ongoing.

Planning:

- Sullivan County has received a 2024 FUDR award in the amount of \$100,000.
- DGA staff offered some assistance related to the submission of a 2025 RAISE (now called the Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development aka BUILD) grant application. A word of acknowledgement to the Planning Department staff for their diligence in composing a strong application; while the program is a highly competitive national program recently subject to changes as result of Executive Orders, we are confident the proposal was well prepared.
- DGA continues to assist the Director of Parks, Recreation and Beautification with the administration of \$125,000 in DASNY funding for the Callicoon Riverside Park. All financial review material requested have been returned to DASNY staff. We await the final approval and Grant Disbursement Agreement from DASNY for execution prior to incurring any project costs. DGA and Parks Director participated in an

informational meeting with DASNY representative, Matthew Stanley, related to the SEQR process on December 6th.

Public Safety:

- DGA staff is on standby to help as needed with the submission of the NY CARES UP grant application, as well as the SAFER application once the program is released.
- DASNY funding in the amount of \$250,000 is anticipated to be submitted for reimbursement well in advance of 3/31/25

Public Works:

• Sullivan County was awarded the 2024 Timber for Transit grant in the amount of 524,800.

In-County Grant Readiness

Preparation of a Grants Best Practices training webinar is underway. The webinar is intended to serve as an annual refresher training modality for County staff who have taken the in-person training.

Administration

DGA has dedicated a significant amount of time this month review records and preparing records past the retention period for disposition. While this may not seem to be the most consequential endeavor, it is nevertheless important and staff has been able to clear space and make room for more current files. In time, efforts will be furthered to digitize any records that must be retained permanently.

Technical Assistance was provided on invasive species management, soil testing, ag assessment, ag districts, ag zoning, farmland preservation, farm funding, farm food safety, orchard management, starting a farm, livestock production, vegetable production, access to wholesale markets, business planning, poultry, field crops and land access.

PAST WORKSHOPS

Growing Microgreens with Painter's Hill Farm (12/4), 5:30-6:30pm: Taught by Manon Frappier, participants set up and take home their own large tray of microgreens, learned about growing techniques, seed varieties and benefits of microgreens.

Strategies for Climate Resilient Farming: Adapting to Changing Growing Seasons (12/12) 88 registered, 31 attended: Part one of our lunch and learn series, in this class we heard from Brett Budde from Majestic Farms and how he has worked to mitigate these affects on his farm and from Kathryn Brignac with CCE Ulster who gave a brief overview of NYS Climate Impact Assessment.

Strategies for Climate Resilient Farming: Mitigating Invasive Plants and Insects (12/19) Registered 72 registered, 21 attended: Part two of our lunch and learn series, in this class we heard from Katie Gasior with CCE Sullivan on topics such as what invasive insects and plant species to keep an eye out for, ways to mitigate their impact on farms and preventative measures gardeners and farmers can take.

Wholesale Market Readiness at Willow Wisp Organic Farm (12/09) 25 registered, 16 attended: Co-hosted with Farm Arts Collective, participants learned about grading, labeling, packaging, and food safety processes to sell products wholesale. The owner and operator of Willow Wisp Organic Farm, Greg Swartz & CCE Ag Production Program Manager, Michelle Proscia explained how to prepare your farm and products to sell wholesale with an emphasis on food safety standards with time for questions. This workshop included a wash & pack barn tour! Following the tour & presentation, participants stayed for networking time with food & drinks provided by Willow Wisp Organic Farm.

Farmer Mixer at The Dale Pizza 12/16, 18 attended: The December Farmer Mixer was hosted at The Dale Pizza in Mountain Dale, NY. This Farmer Mixer was the last of 2024, and it was an opportunity for aspiring, beginner, and seasoned farmers to connect.






