- We are preparing for our busy summer season. We generally see a three-fold increase in our call volume during the summer months. We are in good shape headed into summer.
- We are nearly completed rolling out our countywide subscription to lamResponding which is a cloud-based
 platform which is being shared with all Fire, EMS and our Sheriff's Office to supplement dispatch functions, text
 paging, leveraging smart-phones as pagers, and provides a communication platform within the agency.
- Our department has been meeting with the National Park Service to discuss some upcoming training exercises which will include communications.
- We attended the Sullivan County Fire Chief's meeting to discuss 911 Communications.
- Attended the Hatzalah pre-summer meeting/luncheon
- We are in the process of submitting (2) grant applications for both the NG911 grant program and the SICG

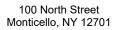

Public Safety Meeting – June 2025

1. Appreciation for Our First Responders

With another busy month behind us, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all Fire, EMS, Police, and 911 Dispatch personnel for their continued professionalism and dedication to public safety.

2. Annual Fire Chiefs Meeting

The Sullivan County Bureau of Fire recently hosted its annual meeting for Fire Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs. We were pleased to have over 70 Chiefs in attendance, representing 32 of our 40 fire departments.

3. Eagle Creek Tabletop Exercise

Alex and I participated in the Annual Eagle Creek Tabletop Exercise focused on Dam Emergency Incident Action Plans. This critical exercise enhances our preparedness for dam-related emergencies.

4. Rehabilitation Team Ready for Summer

The Rehabilitation Team is fully prepared for the summer emergency season. This team supports Fire, EMS, and Law Enforcement during large-scale incidents and prolonged events by providing essential rehab services.

5. Recruitment Task Force Activities

The Recruitment Task Force has been active, attending several community events. Planning is underway for larger upcoming events including the Wurtsboro Street Fair, the Bagel Festival, and The Little World's Fair.

6. Citizen Preparedness Training

In collaboration with the NYS Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services, the Sullivan County Division of Public Safety recently hosted a Citizen Preparedness Training session at the Sullivan County Emergency Services Training Center. The session had 29 participants.

7. Emergency Services Youth Academy

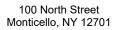
