You must also be one of the following:

- 1 Pregnant, or
- 2 Be responsible for a child 18 years of age or younger, or
- 3 Blind, or
- 4 Have a disability or a family member in your household with a disability, or
- 5 Be 65 years of age or older.
- 6 To be eligible, you must have an annual household income (before taxes) that is below the following amounts:
