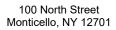

Division of Community Resources Monthly Report

Workforce Development

- ✓ SUNY Sullivan is rescheduling the first CNA class for some time in July. The program is six weeks of classroom training and two weeks of clinical work at Roscoe nursing home. Additional sessions will be offered throughout the year. Recruitment continues.
- ✓ Applications are coming in for the 2022 Summer Youth Employment Program. Interviews will be completed in June, several site areas within the County are being set up, and Crew Leaders are being hired.
- ✓ Johnson Technical College is working with SC BOCES on a use of facilities agreement in order to begin the first Automotive/Diesel Mechanic trade to begin sometime in July.
- ✓ WIOA requires that the WDB competitively procure youth services that are not provided by the grant recipient (the County through CWD). In addition, at least 75% of the funds must be spent on services to out of school youth. We have served out of school youth exclusively for the past 12 years. This year we are looking to 25% of the funding to serve in school youth once again. A Request for Proposal (RFP) was released April 30 with responses due by May 27th.
- ✓ USDOL has issued State allocations for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). Sullivan Counties allocations for the program year 2022 show an increase in Adult funding by 8.61%, an increase in Dislocated Worker funding by 31.43% and an increase in Youth funding by 9.47%. The funding should come in October 2022.
- ✓ The DRC position will work to support and expand partnerships, collaboration, service coordination, and service delivery across multiple education, workforce and disability systems. The increased coordination with systems and the business community will help to create sustainable career paths.
- ✓ <u>Update:</u> Kathleen Poitras has been hired and is working on her credentialing. Services Agreements are being put in place for the County to work with NYESS who will be the administrator of the revenue for the Ticket to Work Program. FBI fingerprinting and background checks to be completed for three staff members essential to this program.

Labor Market Data for April 2022 compared to April 2021

✓ Sullivan County saw an increase 5.2% (1,400) in total nonfarm jobs and an increase 7.1% (1,500) in total private sector jobs.

Sullivan County had the fastest growth year over year in the Hudson Valley region for private sector job gains (7.1%).

Please note: The net month (March '22 – April '22) showed a gain of 2.5% (700) nonfarm jobs and a gain of 3.7% (800) private sector jobs.

- ✓ For Sullivan County the largest job gains were:
 - Leisure & Hospitality at 37.5% (1,200)
 - Manufacturing at 12.5% (200)
 - Other Services at 11.1% (100)
 - Natural Resources, Mining & Construction at 7.7% (100)
 - Information at 100% (100)

The County showed job losses in:

- Trade Transportation and Utilities at -2.3% (-100)
- Government at -1.7% (-100)
- Education and Health Services at -1.4% (-100)

All other industries showed no job growth in April 2022 over April 2021.

✓ NYS showed an increase of 5.0% (449,300) in total nonfarm jobs and 5.5% (411,400) in private sector jobs.

The largest jobs gains were found in:

- Leisure & Hospitality at 24.6% (161,000)
- Professional & Business Services at 5.9% (74,100)
- Trade, Transportation & Utilities at 4.5% (62,900)
- Education and Health Services at 1.8% (38,400)
- ✓ The Hudson Valley region showed an increase of 1.6% (14,400) in total nonfarm jobs and an increase of 2.7% (20,200) in private sector jobs.

The largest job gains were found in:

- Leisure & Hospitality at 12.3% (9,100)
- Other Services at 10.6% (4,000)
- Professional and Business Services at 3.0% (3,300)
- Trade, Transportation & Utilities at 1.4% (2,400)

The Region's job losses were in:

- Government at -3.8% (-5,800)
- Education and Health Services at -.03% (-600)
- Natural Resources, Mining & Construction at -.02% (-100)
- ✓ Sullivan County's unemployment rate was 3.1% for April 2022 down from 5.4% in April 2021.

April 2022 had 36,500 people in the labor force (35,300 employed & 1,500 unemployed). This reflects an overall increase of 800 people in the labor force compared to April 2021.

In April 2020 the unemployment rate was 13.1%. There were 500 more people in the labor force (37,000) then in April 2022. However, there were 3,700 more people unemployed.

- ✓ The Hudson Valley's unemployment rate for April 2022 is 2.9% compared to 5.1% in April 2021.
- ✓ NYS's unemployment rate was 4.2% in April 2022 compared to 7.7% in April 2021.
- ✓ The April 2022 unemployment rates across the 62 NYS counties ranged from a low of 2.3% for Saratoga and Tompkins Counties to a high of 8.3% for Bronx County. Sullivan County with a 3.1% rate ranked 27th in the State along with Wyoming County.
- ✓ Hudson Valley unemployment rankings for April 2022:
 - # 5 Rockland County at 2.6%
 - #7 Putnam County at 2.7%
 - #10 Dutchess County at 2.8%
 - #15 Ulster County at 2.9%
 - #21 Westchester County at 3.0%
 - #21 Orange County at 3.0%
 - #27 Sullivan County at 3.1%

Transportation

- ✓ The Move Sullivan public transit routes provided in the last quarter of 2021 an average of 314 rides per week and 6 residents access the complementary paratransit services.
- ✓ The request for NYSDOT approval of two proposed expansion routes has been submitted. Will do a formal presentation to the Legislature once State level approval has been received.

Community Assistance Center (CAC)

- ✓ The CAC has been coordinating the countywide mask and test kit distribution.
- ✓ We are working with towns, villages, libraries, pharmacies, food pantries, housing complexes, community-based organizations and businesses to help with distribution in their communities.
- ✓ The team continues to provide referral and assistance to callers looking for vaccines and/or information.
- ✓ The CAC remains active providing food assistance deliveries as well as connections to community resources.
- ✓ The Thursday Food Bank deliveries to the pantries are now twice a month. Salvation Army box deliveries continue unchanged.

Office for the Aging - Monthly Report: April 2022 Highlights:

- ✓ Continue to assist with CAC efforts distributing masks and test kits, answering phones, providing referrals and information.
- ✓ Participating in case review with APS regarding mutual clients.
- ✓ Vaccine Hesitancy campaign continuing on YouTube and Facebook marketing showing great engagement so far.
- ✓ OFA newsletter planning ongoing, contracted company making progress in soliciting advertisers, target launch in August 2022. Would greatly expand outreach opportunities both in print and online, at no cost to County.
- ✓ Participation as board member at large of Association on Aging in NY.
- ✓ Preparation for Nutrition and Transportation re-opening targeting early June 2022, initial goal to increase meal delivery to 5 days weekly as per NYSOFA recommendations, institute additional grab & go sites throughout the community in addition to current site in Livingston Manor which has been received well.
- ✓ Continue to participate in Sullivan County Food Security Roundtable efforts.
- ✓ Along with Division, participated in various community outreach events.


RSVP

- ✓ RSVP awarded grant from AmeriCorps in the amount of \$61,361.00 covering the period of 4/1/2022 3/31/2025. RSVP awarded grant from NYSOFA in the amount of \$6,983.00 covering the period of 7/1/21 6/30/22.
- ✓ Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Volunteer Stations has been updated to conform to new AmeriCorps policies, and executed by all parties covering the period of 4/1/2022 3/31/2025.
- ✓ Completed and submitted Federal Progress Report for close out of grant.
- ✓ The AARP Income Tax Aide program ran from 2/7/2022 4/14/2022 providing free tax services for seniors and low to moderate income families in Sullivan County, including free e-filing. A total of 260 individuals/families were served under this program, saving residents \$82,160 in tax return preparation fees.
- ✓ Recruitment efforts included radio interview with Radio Catskill celebrating volunteers during National Volunteer Week (4/17/22 − 4/23/22). Additional recruitment efforts through email blasts and onsite visits. Recruitment: 1 new volunteer in the home delivered meals program; 1 new volunteer at ATI; 1 new volunteer at the Time and the Valley Museum, and 1 new volunteer at the Sullivan County Historical

- Society. One of our displaced volunteers has taken an assignment in our Telephone Reassurance Program.
- ✓ We are pleased to welcome our newest RSVP volunteer station, Delaware Valley Arts Alliance. The Delaware Valley Arts Alliance serves as the Arts Council for Sullivan County. Their home is in Narrowsburg and they service artists and art organizations all over the county and region. They have two exhibition galleries, a recital hall, and they manage the Tusten Theater also in Narrowsburg. They host community art events including Riverfest and The Big Eddy Film Festival.
- ✓ Through RSVP's partnership with the Office of Human Rights, Executive Director, Adrienne Jensen distributed updated RSVP brochures and flyers to the Fallsburg Senior Center, Liberty Senior Center, Liberty Senior Community Housing and the Sleepy Hollow apartment complex.
- ✓ Attended National Service Criminal History Check Training, RSVP Consortium Meeting, and NSCA Town Hall Meeting.

Youth Services:

- ✓ A new Youth Services Manager has been hired to start on May 31st.
- ✓ A new Youth Internship Coordinator has been hired to start on June 20th.
- ✓ Notice was issued for the 2022 OCFS program funding. Applications were due May 23rd.
- ✓ Processing 2021 claims and following up with programs for additional documentation.
- ✓ Working with Division of Health and Family Services staff on updating the OCFS Integrated County Plan. The updated plan is due June 1st.

Narrative of Resolution:

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY PLANNING, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, REAL PROPERTY, CAPITAL PLANNING, AND BUDGETING COMMITTEE FOR THE COUNTY TO JOIN THE SULLIVAN O&W RAIL TRAIL ALLIANCE

WHEREAS, Sullivan County contains a section of the former O&W railroad corridor; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County worked with the Sullivan County municipalities through which the O&W travels in the creation of the *Sullivan O&W Rail Trail Feasibility Study*; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan O&W Rail Trail Feasibility Study details recommendations for building out the rail trail (Trail) in Sullivan County by connecting the existing developed sections to create a 50+/- mile long facility from Mamakating through Rockland, and the creation of a new trail along the former O&W spur line traveling south from Monticello; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of Sullivan County recognizes the Trail provides a multitude of community benefits including enhanced quality of life, better public health, stronger property values, economic development, sales tax revenue, and alternative transportation, and that these benefits will increase as the trail is expanded and improved; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has been engaged with other Trail municipalities and stakeholders in implementation of the *Sullivan O&W Rail Trail Feasibility Study*, collaborating on trail branding, marketing and promotion, clean-up, grant-seeking, and other activities; and

WHEREAS, the *Feasibility Study* recommends "the creation of a trail coalition… to assist municipalities operating and maintaining the trail," further recommending that such group be established as a non-profit 501c3 corporation to accept contributions, and
